understanding of the great prophet he is for our times.

As an intention, we propose most particularly the end of the Coronavirus epidemic, the beatification of Father Henri Caffarel and the sanctification of all the members of Teams of Our Lady.

Getting to know Father Caffarel and the Origin of his Vocation

Henri Caffarel was born on July 30th, 1903, in Lyon, France. He was baptised on August 2nd, 1903 and was ordained a priest in Paris on April 19th, 1930. He died on September 18th, 1996, at Troussures, in the diocese of Beauvais, where he is buried. "At the age of twenty, in just an instant, Jesus Christ became Someone for me. Oh, nothing spectacular. On that far-off day of March 1923, I realised that I was loved and that I loved and that from now on between Him and me, it would be for life. The die was cast." He accepted the invitation to "Come, follow me."

Getting to know Father Caffarel and the Importance of God's love to Him

Father Caffarel's ministry was devoted to the service of love. For him, the love of the Lord was a source of energy and life. From the outset, Father Caffarel was in sync with couples who wanted to develop their love in the light of the Lord. Whatever work he undertook, Father Caffarel had but one goal: to bring everyone before Jesus Christ, who is at the heart of all vocations.

Getting to know Father Caffarel in the Early Days (1939-1949)

Henri Caffarel answered the call of couples who wished to experience fully and deeply their marriage sacrament. He showed them that the requirements of holiness concerned all of them. The first meeting of Teams of Our Lady was held on February 25th, 1939. Four couples came to see him to know how to experience and grow in married love and in the love of God. "Let us seek together," he replied. A few years later, in 1947, the Charter was drawn up and implemented with the rules and concrete means for conjugal spirituality and true Team life (Ecclesia), with a strong emphasis on prayer and mutual aid.

Getting to know Father Caffarel in the Mature Years (1950-1973)

Teams of Our Lady developed rapidly and a sound organisation became necessary. Large international gatherings were organised. Father Caffarel demonstrated how the sacraments of marriage and orders were complementary as responses to the vocation of love. And he always called everyone, firmly and in an exemplary manner, to a life of apostolate in their parish, diocese, in their profession and in the world.

5th Mystery (corresponding to the day)

Getting to know Father Caffarel in the Final Years (1973-1996)

In 1966, he was asked to take over the running of the Retreat House at Troussures, and he made it into a "House of Prayer." There, he organised days and weeks of retreat, showing the value of prayer and silence and offering true encounters with God. The fruitfulness of Father Caffarel's intuition became inscribed in the hearts of everyone, in the unique relationship they have with God. His immense desire was to share the revelation that he himself had known at the age of twenty. His years spent at Troussures show the source from where all things sprung in him.
